Map Making

This month we focused on making the map of the world. We discussed how the globe was cut into two and was made flat to make a map. We then showed the children the map of the continents. Each child was given the opportunity to trace, color, and paint their own map. Depending on their age they either cut labels and matched it to the appropriate continent or they wrote their own labels. The room is filled with beautiful maps!
