#### Practical Life

There was a lot of action in the Practical Life area as the children were introduced to the food preparation activity of Apple Coring. This activity allows the children to prepare their snacks and also make healthy eating choices independently.

The activity of pumpkin polishing was introduced to the children in the Practical Life area. This work develops the child's concentration and strengthens their fine motor skills.

In the Practical Life Area, the younger children have been practicing the Button Frame and the Zipper Frame. These dressing frames prepare the children to dress themselves independently. With the weather getting cooler, they are applying these skills daily!



# Language


The children were introduced to a language program called Wilson's Fundations which focuses on phonics. They also worked with the sandpaper letters; the tactile nature of this work helps the child to learn the shape while practicing the corresponding sound. Sandpaper letters help children gain muscle memory as a pre-writing tool.

## Science


With the festivities of Halloween, the parts of a pumpkin and the lifecycle of a pumpkin were introduced to the children using a real pumpkin.
