Practical Life

The younger children have been practicing the Button Frame and the Zipper Frame in the practical life area. These Dressing Frames prepare the children to dress themselves independently. With the weather getting cooler, they are applying these skills daily!



Language: Sandpaper Letters

The Sandpaper Letters are used to learn the sound and shape of letters of the alphabet. Due to the sandpaper texture of the letters, this material is excellent for muscle memory of the formation of letters and a prelude to writing.



Cultural & Geography

October at ASM is extraordinary because of United Nations Day. We discovered that we are a diverse community of children from China, India, Ireland, Brazil, Italy, Portugal, France, and more! In honor of the UN Day celebration, many children proudly wore the traditional clothing of their families. The classroom was buzzing with excitement as the students' made flags representing country.





Science

The children learned about the parts of a bat. They discovered that there are two different groups of bats: Microbats and Megabats. They also enjoyed making "Parts of a Bat" booklets and fun bat crafts.

Math: Spindle Box

In the math area, some children were introduced to the Spindle Boxes. The Spindle Boxes are part of Maria Montessori's introduction to Numeration. This work combines symbols and quantity and introduces zero as an empty set, while reinforcing one-to-one correspondence.






